

Update on Ground Floor Commercial Lease

I am writing to provide another update on the progress for the ground floor commercial lease. I am excited to announce that Ross House Association has recently signed an updated Heads of Agreement (HOA) for the lease of the ground floor of Ross House. The HOA sets out the agreed key terms in preparation for formal lease.

There will now be a common area at the front of the ground floor that will be shared by Dukes Coffee staff and the new commercial tenant. In order to improve the entry area and design for the new commercial tenant, we are going to widen the stairs that lead up from the main entrance to ground level. These works will be done as part of the broader package of works to clear the ground floor.

We expect construction of a new Ross House reception area, the moving of the remaining ground floor tenants and clearing the ground floor to happen over April & May 2024, the stair widening work will happen during the tenants fit-out phase mid-year. Once a lease has been signed in late March, we will send out the relevant works notifications.

We are thrilled with this progress, as a commercial lease will enable the Association to continue to provide critical facilities to Melbourne's charity and not-for-profit groups into the future. This initiative forms part of our long-term strategic plan and was supported by the RHA Membership at a Special General Meeting of the Association in October 2022.

Building and Maintenance


FROM THE ROSS HOUSE TEAM

Melbourne Metro Rail Update

FROM THE ROSS HOUSE TEAM

These are the planned and current works for the Melbourne Metro Rail Project. Construction works within the Town Hall Station precinct during February 2024 include:

- station entrance construction and station build-out works
- station passenger area and operational rooms construction and fit out
- Campbell Arcade restoration works including fit out of the underground passenger connection to Flinders Street Station
- lift installations within the Degraves Subway at Flinders Street Station
- surface works in Flinders Lane and the adjoining alley ways
- train testing through the tunnel.





We at IndianCare are dedicated to supporting and empowering Indian-origin and other South Asian communities in Victoria, Australia.

As a not-for-profit organisation, our mission revolves around ethno-specific community development and welfare, focusing on addressing the unique challenges faced by migrants in unfamiliar settings.

Cultural displacement and a lack of social capital can often leave members of our community feeling vulnerable to hardship and loneliness. That's where IndianCare steps in. We specialise in connecting our clients with mainstream service providers by providing them with the required information and offering warm referrals.

Our approach is centered on providing support for overall well-being. We operate a helpline that offers assistance to community members facing challenges as migrants. 

Inclusive Meeting Training

BY VOICE AT THE TABLE (VATT)

What is Voice at the Table?

People with cognitive disability are often excluded from committees and consultations. The Voice at the Table Project seeks to create change and ensure that people with cognitive disability can have a real and equal voice on boards, committees, and consultations. This includes people with intellectual disability and acquired brain injury.

What do we do?

- Training for people with cognitive disability about speaking up
- Inclusive meeting training for organisations.
- Meetups for people with cognitive disability who have done training.

Who is the inclusive meetings training for?

Staff working for organisations aiming to ensure people with cognitive disabilities have a genuine say. For example, for committee members, support staff, or people organising consultations.

What do you learn?

- Why inclusive practice is important.
- To identify and understand the barriers to participation for people with cognitive disability.
- Ways to make your meetings welcoming.
- Skills and techniques for getting people with cognitive disability to open up and speak confidently.

How is training delivered?

- Online or in person.
- Training is co-designed and co-facilitated by people with cognitive disability in line with the VATT motto, 'Nothing about us without us'.
- Using plain and easy English.

Tree Project Grow with Us

BY TREE PROJECT

TreeProject has been a part of the wonderful Ross House community for over 20 years. It started in 1989 as a passion project when two women pledged to plant 1 million trees. Fifteen years later that goal was met, and now over 30 years later TreeProject has planted over 2 million trees.

But we don't just plant the trees, we grow them as well – from seed! Our organisation recruits and trains urban volunteers to grow indigenous seedlings in their backyard and nurture them until they are ready to be planted in the ground. The seedlings are then transported to rural landholders and Landcare groups who need our help with revegetation, where another group of volunteers plants these natives in the ground. This way, urban and rural communities work together to put trees back on the land.

This year we have 375 volunteers growing over 134,000 native seedlings that will go a long way to restoring and repairing Victoria's ecosystems.

Our volunteers contribute their time and hard work to propagate and care for seedlings of indigenous plants to keep costs down for landholders. Being able to access 'at-cost' seedlings from TreeProject is often all the incentive and encouragement they need to start restoring areas.
