

The Melbourne Winery October 2024 Update

We would like to give an update on the new commercial ground floor tenant, The Melbourne Winery.

Major construction will soon start on the Melbourne Winery fitout. Originally plans were to be open in time for Christmas 2024, however due to planning delays the tenant is now targeting March 2025 for the opening. Preliminary works have already commenced to reveal the stunning heritage brick work along the eastern columns. RHA, as part of the agreement, will be widening the front stairs to ground level over the next 4-weeks, this will create a more inviting entrance from Flinders Lane.

On page 6 of this newsletter, are some images of the front of Ross House, showing the new decals for the restaurant and some images from inside showing the cleared space and heritage brick work. It will be a busy time over the next 6-months, but we are looking forward to seeing the venue finally opened.

Funds from this commercial tenant will start coming in from 2025, which will enable RHA to improve the facilities and support we can provide to Members & Tenants. Be on the lookout for future community engagement opportunities around the house.


There is always a lot going on in this big old building of ours, so please make sure you keep an eye out for the building maintenance emails that circulate regularly.

Metro Rail Update

FROM THE ROSS HOUSE TEAM

These are the planned and current works for the Melbourne Metro Rail Project. Construction works within the Town Hall Station precinct from September 2024 include:

- station entrance construction and underground build-out works at the City Square, Flinders Quarter and Federation Square sites
- ongoing construction of above ground structures work at City Square
- Campbell Arcade restoration works including fit-out of the underground passenger connection to Flinders Street Station
- installation of an underground stormwater treatment and reuse system (known as a Gross Pollutant Trap) on Swanston Street
- train testing through the tunnel.



The Innovative Design Award is intended to recognise a social impact measurement initiative that promotes emerging or innovative approaches.

What will be funded?




Schizy Inc Tree of Kindness is Flourishing


Mid-Year Lunch Celebrating Disability Pride Event

Green, Growing, Giving – The Indoor Plants of Ross House

The plants we share our space with here at Ross House are the unsung office environment heroes of our community. Within the administration office, shared space, and throughout our meeting rooms you will find these quiet achievers, green, growing and giving.

Benefits of sharing our office and meeting spaces with plants

There have been several proven studies into the benefits of indoor plants. Many we instinctively know, and some you may not have considered.

Did you know?...

- Indoor plants reduce stress and anxiety
- Indoor plants have a positive effect on our overall mental health
- Looking at greenery and nature helps us to feel to calm
- Having plants in the office improves air quality
- Plants in the office space can inspire creativity
- Plants help maintain an optimal level of humidity, creating a healthier work environment
- Plants look great in a decorative sense, and instantly bring 'life' to any room
- A single desk plant can provide our human need to connect with nature (biophilia)

Caring for our plants

The indoor plants here at Ross House are most content with a small drink of water every second Friday (a couple are thirstier and need a drink weekly). Dead leaves are removed each week and pots are turned regularly to allow different leaves a turn by the window.

Every few months our plants enjoy a bit of pampering with leaf spray and some good quality plant food. It's best if well-meaning meeting room users and guests do not water them as this can lead to overwatering, root rot, mould growth etc.


